



### Synopsis:

Several corporations have been measuring the cost-benefits of investing in workplace wellness programs for their employees. Bank of America measured a savings of \$4.96 per employee for every dollar invested in wellness programs. The Los Angeles Fire Department measured 78% ROI or a savings of \$7.80 per employee for every dollar invested. Canada Life Insurance Company measured \$38.50 savings for every dollar invested.

These numbers don't reveal the actual increase in productivity with healthier employees or the fact that a workplace wellness program in place actually attracts new employees and higher performing ones.
